All tracts in the current bidding cycle are for 2 years.

BIDDING

- Bidders may operate ATV's on the county forest for viewing timber sales.
- Bids shall be filled out on bid forms provided and include a deposit of 20% for each tract.
- Bids that are incomplete or inaccurate may be subject to rejection.
- Contractors bidding on more than one tract must submit separate bids and deposits for each tract.
- Each bid must be in its own sealed envelope marked "Timber Sale Bid", "Bidder's Name" and "Tract #"
- Deposits for unsuccessful bids will be returned after bid opening.
- Deposits for successful bids will not be returned until the provision of the contract are fulfilled.
- The Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids when in the best interest of Wood County.

CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

Purchasers must provide the Forest Administrator with a certificate of insurance indicating that Worker's Compensation Insurance Coverage is provided before contracts are issued. Any claims of exemptions must comply with State Statutes and proven in writing prior to bid. Wood County must be named as "Additionally Insured" on insurance certificates. No exceptions will be made unless specifically stated on the sale map.

IRREVOCABLE LETTER OF CREDIT

Contractors wishing to use an Irrevocable Letter of Credit may do so as long as the following criteria are met. It is recommended that criteria be given to the lending institution prior to that institution attempting to draft the Irrevocable Letter of Credit. This will insure that your bid will not be rejected due to an unacceptable Irrevocable Letter of Credit.

Contents of an irrevocable letter of credit must include the following:

- Must be made in favor of Wood County Parks and Forestry Department.
- Letter-of-Credit number.
- A clear statement that it is irrevocable.
- Name of the bank's customer; that is the principal.
- Amount of credit extended (maximum limit). This limit must equal or exceed the penal sum or penalty for which the letter of credit is pledged to secure.
- Must cover the performance of all terms and conditions of the agreement (contract) in addition to stumpage payments.
- Must be negotiable for 6 months beyond the contract length or until released by the County Forest Administrator.
- An authorization to draw sight drafts upon the bank in favor of Wood County Parks and Forestry Department.
- Must state in clear text how drafts are to be made for any default in performance of the contract.
- If partial collection is made on the irrevocable letter of credit, the balance will remain negotiable until the expiration of the letter.

FOREST CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Contractors must provide proof that they are SFI certified.

MILL SCALE TICKET SYSTEM

The Mill Scale Ticket system may be used if approved by the Forest Administrator in advance. All other wood will be scaled at the cutting site. Wood County no longer requires advanced payment for tickets for Contractors in good standing. Further explanation of the requirements of the ticket system may be received by contacting the Forest Administrator.

UTILIZATION SPECIFICATIONS

Utilization is required to the minimum specification of merchantability of each species. The following standards apply for utilization:

Aspen & Hardwood Pulpwood

Pine Pulpwood

Hardwood Sawlogs

Pine Sawlogs

5" top diameter inside bark
4" top diameter inside bark
11" top diameter inside bark
9" top diameter inside bark

- 1. All wood that meets the minimum top diameters at 8'6" will be scaled as a sawlog regardless of the log length or top diameter.
- 2. Merchantable trees are those that have one or more 100-inch pulpwood sticks with a minimum top diameter of five inches (4" for pine).
- 3. Peeled Aspen will be billed at an additional 12.5%.
- 4. Conversion factors if used are as follows: Hardwoods 2.2 cords per thousand board feet and Softwoods at 2.44 cords per thousand board feet.
- 5. Conversion factors for weight scaled wood are as according to the DNR Timber Sale Handbook (current year).



SALE OBJECTIVES: The objectives of this sale will be to harvest and utilize mature timber and regenerate the sale area naturally through seed trees, coppice sprouting, and existing regeneration.

CUTTING AREA DESCRIPTION: This sale is 66 acres in size in one patch separated into two cutting units. Cutting unit, A will be a 40-acre White Pine seed tree harvest, and area B will be a 26 acre coppice harvest of mixed Aspen and Red Maple stands. The entire sale area and the boundary between the cutting units are bounded by either Red or Blue Paint lines or state highway 54. The red paint lines separating units A and B is a double-sided red paint lines with red paint facing both cutting units.

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS/SPECIFICATIONS:

- Unit A Cut all merchantable timber except for White Oak, or any trees marked with red or green paint. Wood County Highway Department has agreed to provide flag crew (if requested) while trees close to HWY 54 are being cut. Advance planning and coordination with the Wood County Forest Administrator and Wood County Highway Department will be necessary in order to secure the flag crew when needed.
- Unit B Cut all Aspen, and Mixed hardwood down to 2" DBH. Do not cut any Oak or Pine unless marked with orange paint.
- Care should be taken to avoid damage to any existing regeneration where possible.
- The standard utilization is 5" minimum top diameter for aspen, oak, and mixed hardwood pulpwood, and to a 4" minimum top diameter for pine pulpwood.
- All species and products must be cut concurrently when harvesting the timber.
- Pine products must be removed from the sale area within two weeks of harvest between April 1st and August 31st to minimize bark beetle buildup.
- All dead trees that do not have commercial value and do not pose a safety hazard shall be left uncut for wildlife benefits.

ACCESS: This sale has good access from an existing logging road that leads directly off Highway 54. Forest Products may be decked along access road. Additional landings and turnarounds may be developed pending approval by the Wood County Forest Administrator.

RESTRICTIONS:

• The county may restrict the type of equipment used on the job if conditions or damage warrant. Logging chance is dependent on ground and weather conditions. Soils will require very dry and firm conditions for harvest.

OTHER SALE REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS:

- The logging contractor will be responsible for treating cut pine stumps with Cellu-Treat to prevent infection from Annosum root rot. Application of the fungicide is required on all pine stumps within 24 hours of cutting from April 1st through November 30th. Wood County will provide the fungicide if needed. Contractor should contact the forest administrator in advance to ensure an adequate supply is on hand.
- Contractor should be aware there is a small amount of buckthorn present on the site. Proper equipment cleaning
 measures will be needed to help stop the spread of this invasive.



Additional objective will be to harvest any trees over 2" DBH to begin to prepare the area for future replanting. All trees within the harvest area over 2" will be cut in addition any dead trees that are not a safety hazard will be cut and bucked into smaller sections to help prepare that area for mechanical site prep and planting.





SALE OBJECTIVES: The harvest area consists of three harvest prescriptions: Oak Thinning, Oak Shelterwood, and Maple Clearcut. The objectives of the harvest are to improve future oak sawlog quality and to regenerate oak, maple, and aspen forests.

CUTTING AREA DESCRIPTION: The timber sale cutting units are bounded by red and blue paint lines. Timber quality is good. Harvest units are mostly high ground with sandy loam soils although the ground is somewhat wet between cutting units B and C at the south end of the sale. Access to unit C will most likely require frozen ground conditions.

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS/SPECIFICATIONS:

• Cutting Unit A - Oak Thinning (22 acres):

Cut all merchantable aspen and birch. Cut only those oak and mixed hardwoods marked with orange paint.

• Cutting Unit B - Oak Shelterwood Harvest (23 acres):

Cut all merchantable aspen, birch and mixed hardwoods. Cut only those oak marked with orange paint.

Cutting Unit C - Maple Clearcut (12 acres)

Cut all aspen, birch, and mixed hardwoods 2" in diameter or larger. Cut only those oak marked with orange paint.

- Cut designated trees with one or more 100" sticks (pulp) or with one or more 8'6" sawlogs. Sawlog minimum top diameter is 11" inside bark for an 8'6" sawlog. The standard utilization is 5" minimum top diameter for all species on the sale.
- Contractor is encouraged to leave standing dead trees uncut and undamaged for wildlife purposes. Standing dead trees may be cut at loggers discretion if they pose a safety hazard.
- All species and products must be cut concurrently when harvesting the timber. Logs and bolts may require scaling in the field. Bolts
 destined to a mill that buys on weight may be allowed to go on tickets.

ACCESS: Access to the sale is from a private road coming east off of County Road ZZ in Jackson County, approximately 3 miles north and west of the intersection with HWY 54. The owner has given verbal permission for access however, the contractor is encouraged to contact the owner in advance of logging operations. The timber sale lies approximately one mile east on this private road. The private road will be flagged at the intersection with Co. ZZ. Potential landing sites are available along logging roads shown on the map and on private lands west of the sale with permission from the owner. The main gravel road running north through cutting unit B must be kept open for access to an adjacent cranberry marsh north of the county forest.


- The county may restrict the type of equipment used on the job if conditions or damage warrant.
- . Harvest activity will not be allowed in unit C from June 1 through August 15 due to endangered species concerns
- Harvesting is not allowed from April 1 through July 15 due to oak wilt concerns. Outside of these dates, logging chance is dependent on
 ground and weather conditions. Soils are seasonally wet in places within the cutting units and especially in access to cutting unit C.

SALE OBJECTIVES: This timber sale consists of several relatively small cutting units and involves a combination of final harvests and thinnings. Purposes of harvest include: Final harvest red pine in preparation for replanting; thin plantations to improve growth and quality on remaining trees; harvest declining jack pine to avoid further loss of value.

<u>CUTTING AREA DESCRIPTION</u>: The timber sale cutting units are partially bounded by red paint lines. Otherwise, where no red paint lines exist, other obvious changes in habitat delineate cutting boundaries (i.e. transition to marsh). Red pine timber quality is very good, while jack pine is in poor health and timber quality is relatively poor. Portions of the sale areas and access to them may require frozen ground to operate depending on weather patterns at the time of harvest.

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS/SPECIFICATIONS:

Cutting Unit A and D – Red Pine Final Harvest (6 acres, 2 acres):

Cut all merchantable trees. Cut all non-merchantable trees down to 2" minimum dbh. Cut all standing dead trees providing they do not pose a safety hazard to operators. All dead trees shall be bucked into six foot or smaller lengths to assist with future site prep and planting plans.

• Cutting Unit B – Jack Pine, Red Pine Final Harvest (19 acres):

Cut all merchantable trees except for any tree marked with green paint (mostly white pine).

• Cutting Unit C - Harvest Scattered Mature (5 acres)

Cut all merchantable red pine, jack pine, and any other tree marked with orange paint. Take care to avoid damage to residual trees and natural regeneration. Any other tree severely damaged in the course of harvesting operations shall be cut and merchantable forest products shall be utilized.

• Cutting Unit E - Red Pine First Thinning (3 acres):


Cut all red and jack pine in rows marked with orange paint (approximately every third tree in cut rows has been marked). Also Cut any tree in between adjacent rows necessary to allow machinery operations.

- Cut and utilize designated trees with one or more 100" sticks (pulp) or with one or more 8'6" sawlogs. Sawlog minimum top diameter is 11" inside bark for an 8'6" sawlog. The standard utilization is 5" minimum top diameter for oak and mixed hardwood pulpwood, and 4 "for pine pulpwood.
- All species and products must be cut concurrently when harvesting the timber. Logs and bolts may require scaling in the field. Bolts
 destined to a mill that buys on weight may be allowed to go on tickets.
- Pine products must be removed from the sale area within two weeks of harvest between April 1st and August 31st to minimize bark beetle buildup.
- The logging contractor will be responsible for treating cut pine stumps with Cellu-Treat to prevent infection from Annosum root rot. Application of the fungicide is required on all pine stumps within 24 hours of cutting from April 1st through November 30th. Wood County will provide the fungicide if needed. Contractor should contact the forest administrator in advance to ensure an adequate supply is on hand.

ACCESS: Good access to southernmost sale units exists via forest roads that intersect County Highway X just west of Dexterville WI (see map). These roads may require a small amount of improvement to allow pulp trucks. Wood may be decked along woods roads, and landings and turnarounds may be expanded pending approval by Forest Administrator. Unit A may be accessed either by a short woods road running north from HWY 54 or by an old woods road that intersects Park Road. This road is bermed and will require some improvement. Contractors should be aware that a WDNR stream crossing permit will most likely be necessary in order to access cutting unit "B". Wood County will work with contractor to determine location and crossing design, and will apply for the permit.

- The county may restrict the type of equipment used on the job if conditions or damage warrant.
- Harvesting is not allowed in units B and C from April 1 through July 15 due to oak wilt concerns. Outside of these dates, logging chance
